On March 24, 1916, an explosion heavily damaged the *Sussex*, a French passenger ferry. Eighty casualties, including 50 deaths, were reported, and several Americans were among the casualties. A German submarine was firing in the area, but the Germans claimed that the submarine was firing at a minesweeper, not at the *Sussex*, and that the *Sussex* must have struck a British mine. However, when the ship made it into port, evidence showed that a torpedo, not a mine, caused the damage. American newspapers and the American public are outraged.
