## NHD How to: CHOOSE a TOPIC

## The Importance of Topic Choice:

You're going to be working on this project an awful lot for an awfully long time. Conceivably, you could be working on this ALL school year; that's 10 months. That's about 5% of your entire life. Furthermore, you will have times when you are making little progress. Obstacles, dead ends, frustrations are inevitable. Pick something that will make your time and effort worthwhile.

## DO's

- (1) Pick something you are interested in.
- (2) Consider your personal skills & talents.
  - **a.** Language skills
  - **b.** Personal Contacts
  - **c.** What do you have or what can you do that most other students can't?
- (3) Consider local resources
  - **a.** What unique stuff do you have access to?
- (4) Check list of suggested topics on NHD website
  - **a.** Even if none of the topics suits you, the list might help your own brainstorming
- (5) Consider historical significance of you topic possibilities
  - a. One factor upon which you are judged is significance
- (6) Consider topic choice in conjunction with category choice
  - a. Ex. Visuals are often very difficult to get for ancient history topics

## DON'T's

- (1) Pick a topic because you think it will be "easy"
  - a. This project is not "easy". If you're finding it easy, you're doing it wrong or badly...probably both
- (2) Pick a current event
  - a. Difficult to argue historical significance
  - b. (Easy to alienate judges)
- (3) Pick a pop culture topic
  - a. How historically significant is a piece of pop culture regardless of how popular it is?
  - b. Even if it is historically significant, you will have difficulty convincing judges as they will assume that it is not
- (4) Pick a controversial topic upon which you have a strongly held belief
  - a. Projects are judged on balance and it will be hard to avoid becoming a victim of your bias
  - b. (If controversy is especially heated, it will be easy to alienate judges)
