

 - History of Interpretations


Frederick Jackson Turner

- 1861-1932
- Professional Historian:
 Univ of Wisconsin
- Turner Thesis:
 - Speech at ColumbianExposition (1893)
 - Frontier experience created a uniqueAmerican culture

 - Wild West Show





TURNER VISION of the West


- Peaceful conquest of the untamed land





Commoditization of The West

- Cashing in on heroic myth of the west
 - Association of western mythological concepts to <u>commodities</u> (things for sale)





"New Left" Revisionism

- A New Look/Reinterpretation
- "New Left"
 - Movement of 1960s & 70s
 - Criticism of traditional heroic view of American history from the "left" (of the political spectrum)
 - Emphasis on "marginalized" people (those left out of traditional history)
 - Ex People of color, Women, Working Class
 - More recently: Gender, Sexuality
