



TURNING POINT: GOV'T SHOULD "DO SOMETHING" • Changed role of gov't -FROM protector of rights • Formerly thought to be best achieved by staying out of people's lives -TO promoter of "general welfare" • Now thought to require active gov't

3 GOALS of the NEW DEAL 3 R's

- <u>RELIEF</u>—relief for those suffering
- <u>RECOVERY</u>—economic recovery
- <u>REFORM</u>—fix the institutions that broke down & led to depression

- Liberal: New Deal is..
 - Pro-business
 - Too conservative; Not enough done for little guy
- <u>**Radical</u>** (Huey Long & Share the Wealth)</u>
 - New Deal doesn't do enough
 - Protects the Rich
